#### You Said, We Did

Last year was our first entry into North West in Bloom and specifically into the 'It's Your Neighbourhood' category, we were delighted to achieve a "Thriving". Based on the feedback from the judges last year we have made the following improvements:

- Last year the judges suggested we "increase the use of sustainable plants in the beds" this year we have added further plants/shrubs such as coreopsis, buddleias, campanulas, thyme, ajuga reptans and perennial wallflowers.
- The judges also suggested we "brighten up the entrances to the park to make it more appealing to visit. We applied for funding from Comic Relief and have introduced several tree carvings throughout the park (we have sited one at each entrance on Moorside Road to make it more appealing).
- We have worked with Barclays Bank, Crosby as part of their 'Make a Difference' day to improve both entrances with additional plants and shrubs
- We have added 2 planters (made from reclaimed wooden pallets) next to the noticeboard to make this into more of a feature, and draw people's attention to the noticeboard

#### Celebrating 50 Years of In Bloom.

To commemorate the fact that 'In Bloom' is celebrating being 50 years old this year we have tried to incorporate this theme into our display this year:

- Our Yarnbomb features a special celebratory "50 years in Bloom" personalized squares display
- Several of our plants are gold/yellow to mark this occasion (including marigolds, sunflowers and coreopsis)

#### **Community Involvement**

We continue to hold our monthly gardening & litter picking sessions, with local residents and businesses getting involved. We continue to maintain the rose gardens.





We replanted our wildflower meadow and added 700 saplings at an event we organized with Mersey Forrest, Great Crosby RC School and Sefton Council.









#### **Our Events**

Throughout the year we organise a variety of events/activities to bring new people into the park and take advantage of the free resources. We offer these on a free/subsidised basis thanks to funding from grant applications or our own fundraising:

### **Environmental Quality**



We have incorporated plants into the park which will encourage wildlife such as buddleias, coreopsis, lavender, willows and native trees and shrubs.

We replanted the wild flower meadow with the help and local children and sowed field poppy, corncockle, cornflower and other native wild flowers. We had 60 bee boxes and packets of wild flower seeds for them to take home to their own gardens.
